How to Use and Protect Your ConnectCard User Guide

“Free Fare” Participants Only

Using your ConnectCard to pay your fare

1. When you board the bus or a light rail vehicle, simply tap your ConnectCard to the orange target on the farebox. Be sure the target light is green and the correct fare is displayed before tapping your card.
2. Listen for the tone and look for the display message.
 - A single tone indicates that your card is valid.
 - A triple tone indicates either the farebox was unable to read your card, your card is not valid or additional fare is needed.
3. If your card was unreadable or not valid, tap your card to the farebox a second time.
4. If the triple tone persists, your card may not be functioning properly or it may be invalid. Please contact dhsallegheny-discounted-fares-pilot@alleghenycounty.us for assistance.



ConnectCard validators will be installed at most high-level light rail station platforms and Downtown light rail stations. The validators will enable ConnectCard customers to bypass the line at the farebooth and still be able tap their card to pay their fare.

ConnectCard offers convenient fare options

- 7-day pass
- 31-day pass
- 365-day pass
- Stored cash value (from \$.05-\$200)

This option work just like cash and is a great option for occasional riders.



Protecting your ConnectCard

ConnectCards have components that can become damaged. Below are a few helpful hints to protect your ConnectCard and keep it working properly:

1. Keep the card in a safe place (like a wallet) to help ensure that it doesn't become scratched or cracked.
2. Be careful not to wash it when doing laundry.
3. Do not punch a hole in it to put it on a lanyard or key chain.
4. Keep your ConnectCard separated from other smart cards when tapping it on the farebox. Another smart card will not damage your ConnectCard, but it could prevent the farebox from reading it accurately.
